A MESSAGE FROM THE MLA PRESIDENT

Dear MLA Members,

It has been a great privilege to serve as your association President this past year. At the beginning of the year I proposed not goals, but a presidential framework to guide our actions and efforts: **Engage our core. Expand our coalition. Construct our future.** I’m pleased (and a little relieved!) to be able to point to accomplishments that we have had in all three of these areas.

Engage our core

Our core is our members, and MLA is now more than 4,000 members strong! We have been able to achieve this through the strength of our affiliates program and the addition of two new affiliate members, which enables every employee of that organization to be an MLA member. With so many members, our next aspiration is to make every one of those members an engaged member. This year, we’ve strengthened that in a number of ways: we’ve distributed \$9,000 in educational scholarships, we’ve formed an MLA Chats Coordinating Committee to sustain “MLA Chats” as a member-only opportunity, we’ve developed an Affinity Networks program, and we’ve formed our tenth interest group - the Immigrant Engagement Interest Group. And, as we do, we hosted another successful conference with over 600 attendees.

Expand our coalition

I knew this was going to be a great year when one of my very first activities as President was to help represent libraries at a water ballet in Baltimore about book bans. That’s fighting for the right to read as only Baltimore can! This was one of several activities where we’ve been able to work with emerging partners and help inform Maryland residents about the great things that our libraries are doing to support them.

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Other events included tabling at Poe Fest and University of Maryland's "Maryland Day", as well as partnering with Maryland Public Television (MPT) for an online public screening of The Librarians that concluded with a post-screening panel of Maryland librarians. These outreach activities that activate our partners and our communities align with our recently launched Support Maryland Libraries campaign (supportmdlibraries.org).

Last but not least, as a benefit directly to our members, we formed a partnership with Sustainable Libraries Initiative that provides resources to help Maryland libraries become more sustainable, helping us to live our professional values.

Construct our future

Our future is built step-by-step, every day by what we do. Advocacy is a significant part of that. This year we hosted another successful Maryland Library Legislative Day – a key moment to showcase the value of libraries and advocate for library-positive legislation. We have also shown resistance to developments that would negatively impact libraries and the communities we serve through statements and letters, including in opposition to House Resolution 7661, which would allow the federal government to ban books and regulate the right to read. How we work is equally important to what we do. This year, we developed a Statement Release Framework to help us determine when we should speak out about issues, we implemented a Code of Conduct, and we revised and reaffirmed our Statement on Professional Ethics. All of these efforts help build a world that looks a little more like one we want to live in. There's still more to do!

I want to close with a note of thanks. We would need a much longer report to list everyone who deserves credit for making everything that I've mentioned happen. Frankly, very little of it is anything that I can take credit for. The members of our Executive Board and Advisory Council, leaders of our divisions, interest groups, committees, and panels, and our dedicated MLA staff – Josh and Danielle – are who make these things happen. As do you, each and every MLA member, whether it's participating in a program, sharing feedback about what you'd like to see from MLA, or reading this membership report. You're the reason MLA exists. Tell a colleague: There's never been a better time to be an MLA member!

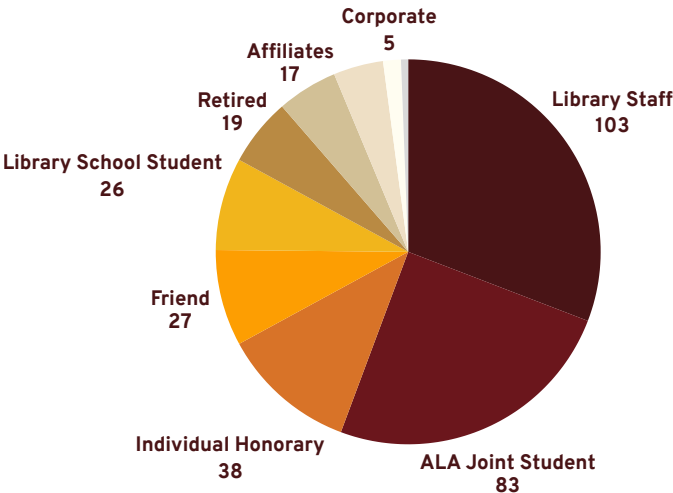

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SUPPORT MARYLAND LIBRARIES CAMPAIGN

This year, we launched the Support Maryland Libraries campaign website – a new initiative made possible through a grant from the American Library Association. LEGISLATIVE PANEL REPORT

Liz Sundermann-Zinger, Chair

Our legislative priorities this year were passing bills that would increase library funding in Maryland, and we were very successful!

The State Library Resource Center funding bill SB410/HB660 passed with multiple sponsors and bipartisan support. This bill will increase the funding for SLRC each year through FY31.

The county and regional funding bill SB378/HB1592 also passed, creating increases in that funding through FY32. Although we didn't receive the full funding amount we asked for, these increases will definitely help. In a revision, the General Assembly also included additional funding for the Young Readers/Dolly Parton Imagination Library program.

The bill allowing for student members on public library boards, SB535/HB586 also passed, and included the amendments we asked for, ensuring that the bill provides the opportunity, not the mandate, for student members.

Legislative Day was another success! Many library systems were represented by staff and board members, and several members of the General Assembly stopped by the breakfast to say hello and/or give remarks including Senator McCray, Delegate Behler, and Senator Lam. Thanks as always to the support lent by the Maryland State Library Agency!

The Legislative panel worked with LAIG to provide advocacy training support for Library Legislative Day and at the MLA|DLA Annual Conference. LAIG held several other advocacy sessions on their own!

At the federal level, IMLS was reinstated and received all allocated funds.

There continue to be federal and local battles around censorship and the freedom to read that we will track closely in fiscal year 2026-2027, and advocacy and getting out the vote will also be priorities in the upcoming year.

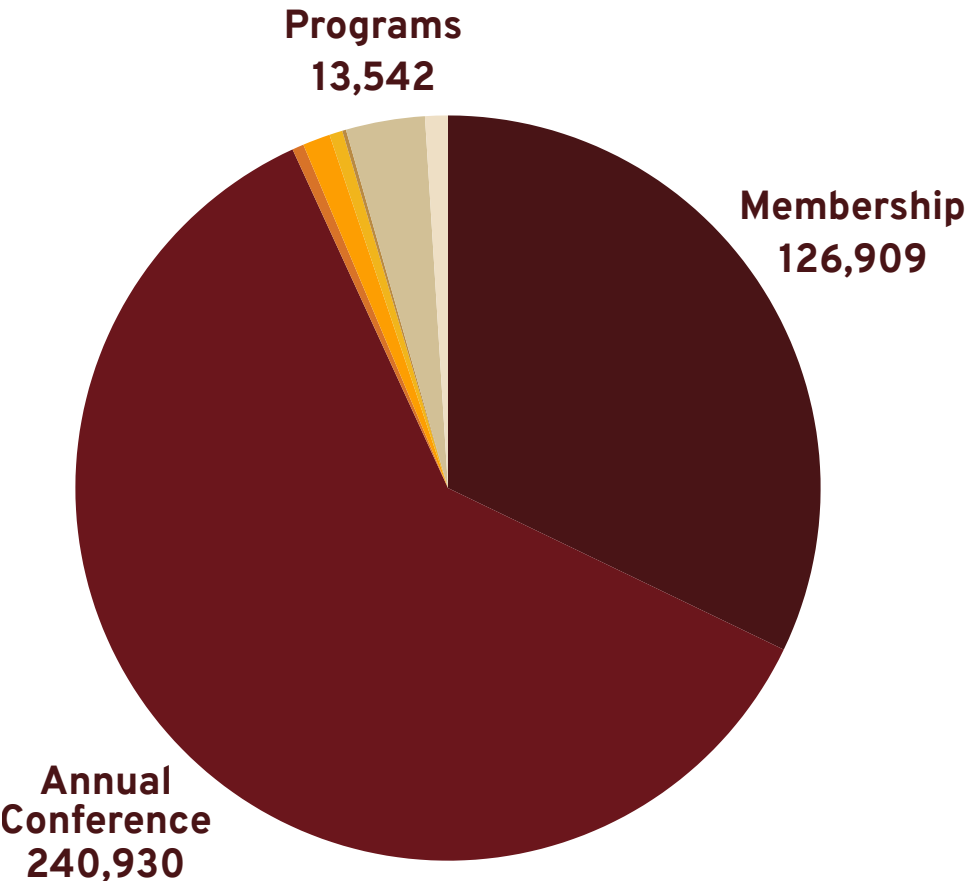

A MESSAGE FROM THE INCOMING MLA PRESIDENT

Hello MLA!

As we wrap up last fiscal year, I'm excited to begin my term as President of the Maryland Library Association. Throughout this past year as Vice President, I have spent time meeting with various units and individuals. We've talked about how things are going with MLA and ways to get involved further. I learned that many of you are interested in getting involved – you just don't know how! Some of you want to jump in, but you're worried about the time commitment. From those meetings and observations, I have developed the following goals for my presidential year.

Unit efficiency

Over the past couple of years, MLA has worked on an audit of divisions and interest groups, leading to a new structure of interest groups housed under divisions. This coming year, I plan to work with current committees and panels in a similar way to determine overlaps and gaps in how they meet the needs of membership and the organization. This may look like adding committees, combining efforts of existing units, or sunseting groups that haven't been needed.

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Advocacy

Recently, MLA has had opportunities to do outreach in the central Maryland area, which has provided valuable time discussing the association and ways for people to help advocate for libraries regardless of who they are. And now, MLA has an exciting new advocacy hub in the Support Maryland Libraries website, which highlights opportunities for how to promote and support libraries for all, not just library staff. We know, though, that advocacy for libraries and the work MLA does needs to go beyond just central Maryland. This year, I plan to investigate possible opportunities for advocacy outreach beyond central Maryland in the future, building off of the tools created on the new website.

Succession planning

The only way we can maintain an organization like MLA is with an engaged and involved membership. MLA is always in need of new faces taking on leadership roles of all kinds. We have a newly large membership base (over 4,000!), many of whom may not know they are members or all the ways to get involved. As I met with folks this past year, it was clear that many people would love to jump in, if only they knew how. Through this coming year, I plan to work on strategies to promote opportunities for leadership and participation in MLA to the membership base.

As I move forward in my role as president, my biggest goal, however, is to find opportunities to hear from you all. How do you want to be connected with MLA? What is happening in your professional world that you wish MLA knew about? My hope is to serve all walks of library workers from all across the state.
